




BOX 2 FLOWERS & 3 BUTTERFLIES

# **Assembly instructions**

### Supplied materials

- Cut-out pieces:
  - 3 butterflies.
  - 3 cut-outs for the little flower,
  - 15 cut-outs for the big flower.
- Rubber stopper.
- Metal rods.
- A wooden stick.
- A bottle.
- Sand.



#### Necessary materials (not supplied)

- A needle.
- Round nose pliers.
- A piece of thick cardboard.
- Cutting pliers.

#### **Advice**


- Start by taking all the items out of the box to fully understand the contents and which cut-outs make up each flower.
- Handle cut-outs and stems with care.

## **ASSEMBLING THE FLOWERS**

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#### For the little flower:

Place the 3 cut-outs on top of each other on the cardboard and make a hole in the center using the needle.



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
Make a loop at the end of the 2 stems.



Thread a metal rod through the hole and slide the flowers (from the smallest to the largest) until the loop.


Do the same with the rubber stopper.

Bend your rod slightly to show the flower properly.




Repeat the beginning of the previous step with the 5 cut-outs of the big flower.

Overlap them, punch through the center and set them a side.



To make the heart of the flower: fold the 9 pieces of the pistil in two and place them together by gluing the two sides in contact, repeat until all 9 pieces are glued together.

Gently unfold the pieces and glue the ends together to form the entire pistil.






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
Thread the cut-outs as shown in the diagrams opposite. Separate the petals of the 3rd cut-out. Finish by putting on a rubber stopper to hold


the finished piece in place. You can now bend your rod slightly.



ASSEMBLING THE BUTTERFLIES

Overlay the 3 butterflies on the cardboard and punch through the center with the needle.






You have made your bouquet. Use the cutting pliers to adjust the height of your stems.

It's time to unscrew the cap from the small bottle and plant your pretty creation.

Take the two remaining stems attached by a rubber stopper.

1. Thread the rubber stopper onto the rods.

- 2. Thread the butterflies.
- 3. Using round pliers, form a loop at the end of the rod.
- 4. Gently push your butterflies then the stoppers to wedge them at the loop.
- 5. Bend the second rod in half at the point of the rubber stopper to give a sense of flight.
- 6. Using the stick, turn and bend the wings, to bring them to life. This is done by delicately stretching the wings by running them between the stick and your thumb.
