






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
# **Assembly instructions**

#### Supplied materials

- String lights
- Paper (7 colors)
- A variety of preserved foliage
- Wire
- Metal stems
- Various types of stamens
- Rubber end caps














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#### Necessary materials (not supplied)

- Wire cutters
- Round-nose pliers
- Scissors
- Needle
- Glue gun or glue tube (if needed)


#### Advice

- Begin by taking all the items out of the box to familiarize yourself with the contents.
- Prepare your tools in advance.
- Handle the items with care.



#### 1


Start by cutting along the dotted lines to create the shape, which will serve as the template for all your petals.



#### 2

Cut 3 pieces of each color to create all your petals.

To familiarize yourself with the texture of the paper, feel it and you'll notice that it stretches in one direction but not the other. This is a distinctive feature of crepe paper.



Make sure to take the stretching direction of the paper into account when positioning the cutting shape.


Pay attention to the vertical orientation of the shape by using the arrow drawn on your template as a guide.

#### FOR THE LARGE FLOWER

# 3

Cut the wire into pieces 10 cm long.


You will get 7 pieces, which will be used to assemble your flower clusters onto the string lights.



# 4

Cut the metal stems into pieces 8 cm long.

You will need a total of 7 pieces to create the supports for the flower clusters.






# 5

Remove the string lights from their packaging and carefully unfold them.

Pull the tab to connect the batteries.

You will find a switch that allows you to choose from different lighting modes: steady, flashing, and fast flashing.







Use round-nose pliers to form a loop at one end of each piece of stem you previously cut.

Repeat this step for the remaining 6 pieces of stem.



#### 7


Take the stamens. Each stamen consists of a wire with a small colored ball at each end.

Gently open the loop you just created and pass the 5 strands through it.

Close the loop by tightening it as much as possible to hold the stamens in place.


Fold the strands in half to form a small bouquet of stamens.

If necessary, you can add a dab of glue to secure everything in place.




#### 8

Pierce the center of your double-petal cutouts using a large needle, placing them on a piece of cardboard.



# 9


Twist each petal tightly to form a scroll. You can twist 3 petals at the same time.



### 10

Open them by stretching the center of each petal as if forming a cup.


Do not touch the ends; the more wrinkled they are, the prettier it will look.



### 11

Take the stem with the stamens and thread it through the hole, passing it through the 3 double petals.


Slide the rubber end cap onto the stem, up to the loop, to secure the whole assembly in place.



Repeat this process 6 more times to create a total of 7 flowers to attach to your string lights. Feel free to shape and adjust your flowers according to your personal preferences.


### 12

The string lights are 2 meters long. Attach the first flower in the middle of the string, then place the others on either side, with an interval of approximately 26 cm between each flower.



### 13

Take a piece of wire to attach your flower and a dried flower stem to the string lights, making sure to position it between two LEDs.



### 14

Gather the flower stem, dried flower stem, and string lights, then wrap the wire tightly around them.

You can trim any excess stem to achieve a neat finish.

Repeat this process for the remaining flowers along the entire length of the string lights.



To prevent any risk of overheating, it is essential to ensure that neither the paper nor any other objects come into direct contact with the LEDs of the string lights.

# 15

Congratulations, you have completed your beautiful string lights!

All that's left is to find a lovely spot to admire them.



Make sure not to leave the string lights on unattended.
