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

Assembly instructions

Supplied materials

- The pre-cut elements
- The rubber end caps
- The metal washers
- The separator elements
- The metal stems
- A bottle with sand



Necessary materials (not supplied)

- A needle
- Round-nose pliers
- Wire cutters
- A tube of glue
- A piece of thick cardboard

Advice

- Start by taking all the items out of the box to familiarize yourself with the contents.
- Handle the cutouts and stems with care.


Start by forming a loop at the end of 4 stems using your round-nose pliers.




ASSEMBLY OF THE LARGEST FLOWER

Stack the 3 elements and pierce the center using the needle, placing them on the cardboard.


Start by sliding the metal washer onto the stem until it reaches the loop.

Slide the smallest flower onto the stem, followed by a separator element.

Then, slide the second flower, add another separator element, and finish with the third flower.


End with the rubber end cap to secure the flower onto the stem.

Gently bend the stem to position the flower so you can see it clearly.


Start by gluing the round element to the back of the pre-cut shape.

Repeat step #2 with the two elements.

Stack them on top of each other and pierce a hole through both.


Start by sliding the metal washer onto the stem until it reaches the loop.

Slide the smallest flower onto the stem, followed by a separator element.

Then, slide the second flower onto the stem.

Finish by securing everything with the rubber end cap to hold the flower in place on the stem.

Gently bend the stem to position the flower so it is clearly visible.





THE LONG PETAL

Start by gluing the back of the two pre-cut petals.

Take a stem, place it on top of one petal, then stack the second petal on top of the first, covering the stem.



ASSEMBLY OF THE FIREWORK FLOWER




For the two firework flowers, pierce the center of the shape using the needle, placing it on the cardboard.

Slide the metal washer onto the stem until it reaches the loop.

Next, slide the smallest flower onto the stem, followed by the sequin (metal washer) to secure the flower in place.

Finish by adding the rubber end cap to firmly hold the flower onto the stem.

You have assembled your bouquet. Now, it's time to unscrew the cap of the small bottle and place your

beautiful arrangement inside.



Additional Notes

• Use wire cutters to adjust the height of your stems to your desired length.
